Whether you go out bird watching regularly or just enjoy noting what you see when out on a walk, any record of what you see is important to help us keep an up to date database of the birds of Cyprus.

Most people submit their records on a monthly basis. To be included in the Systematic List that appears in the Monthly Checklist please make sure that Jane receives your records by the 10th of the following month or are added to BirdTrack by that date. But don't worry if you miss the deadline, your sightings will still be added to the database and be used in compiling the annual Cyprus Bird Report. On occasions, you may be asked to provide extra details of rarer birds or of those seen out of season or away from their usual locations. This is something that happens to all observers and is not a reflection on anyone's bird watching skills! A list of the species for which a Rare Bird Report is required can be obtained from Jane.

There are several ways to make sure that your records count by submitting them to the BirdLife Cyprus Recorder, Jane Stylianou who will add them to the country database:

Use the Cyprus portal of BirdTrack <http://blc.birdtrack.net> or download our [reporting excel](#). The recorder is happy to receive your sightings by email but where possible please try to use either BirdTrack or the Excel form. The Cyprus Bird Report 2017 is now available. The report contains 53 colour photos, the 2017 Systematic List of 308 observed species or recognised forms which was compiled from nearly 69,000 records and the 2017 Ringing report. Plus papers on the first White-eyed Gull in Cyprus; the study of migration with Cyprus Wheatears; the BirdLife Cyprus 2017 monitoring programmes; the breeding success, wintering ecology and migratory behaviour of Eleonora's Falcon in Cyprus and breeding Cyprus Scops Owl in a Cyprus garden. The Report includes species charts and tables and a full Cyprus bird List. The front cover features a male White-throated Robin photographed at Cape Greco. The Report will be sent automatically to those BirdLife Cyprus members whose subscription includes it. Extra copies can be purchased if required by contacting the BirdLife Cyprus office.

FIELD MEETING - PAPHOS LIGHTHOUSE - 16th FEBRUARY 2019

The morning started with black skies and torrential rain as we made our way to the designated meeting at Konia. As we had done a 'recce' days earlier at Armou, the proposed area for the field trip and decided that due to some of the tracks being impassable and fields flooded from the heavy rain over the past few months, that if anyone turned up for the trip, we would conduct the trip around Paphos Lighthouse.

As it happened four people attended, including myself and we made our way down to the Lighthouse, and to our surprise the clouds parted and the sun appeared as we arrived. As we made our way to the entrance the first bird of the day, a **Hoopoe**, was seen feeding on the ground adjacent to the fence outside the site, a good start we thought!

We then made our way down the avenue of trees in front of the Frankish Fort where many species were feeding on the ground and drinking from the puddles, formed by the overnight rain. Amongst the many **Chaffinch**, **Greenfinch**, **Goldfinch**, **House** and **Spanish Sparrows** were a couple of **Woodlark**, a winter visitor seen regularly on the site.

As we walked on a couple of **White Wagtail** were seen and to our surprise, a **Grey Wagtail** feeding around a puddle, not a common sight here. Several **Barn Swallows** had commenced feeding above us with the arrival of the sun and a party of **Hooded Crows** squabbled in the trees above us. A couple of female **Black Redstarts** were chasing each other around the ruins of the Frankish Fort as we heard the distant call of a **Great Spotted Cuckoo**.

We then proceeded towards the Odeon through the orchard where we saw a couple of **Stonechat**, perched on the tall wild fennel stalks and many **Chiffchaff** feeding on the lower foliage. A **Song Thrush** was heard singing close by but quickly flew into deep cover as we approached.

A couple of **Collared Dove** burst noisily from a nearby tree and above a **Common Kestrel** circled, no doubt looking for its breakfast!

Great Tits were in profusion, calling from the trees all around us and we observed our first male Black Redstart. On the large open area of the Odeon there were many **Meadow Pipit** feeding on the ground at that point the Great Spotted Cuckoo that we had heard earlier flew overhead, calling as it did.

Amongst the feeding Meadow Pipit were a number of **Skylark** and a **Corn Bunting** was singing, perched on a tall stalk. At that point a group of **Cormorant** were seen, fourteen of them, flying north/west in formation. Amongst the feeding Swallows overhead were a couple of **House Martin**, flying slightly higher than the swallows. To the north, five **Yellow-legged Gulls** were making their way south, presumably from their roost at Cape Drepanum to the north.

At this point the sky clouded over again, with the promise of more heavy rain so we made our way back towards the car park seeing many **Crested Lark** feeding on the ground and finally an **Isabelline Wheatear** gave us good views as it popped onto a nearby rock, a good end to the trip! So from a day that promised nothing, weather wise, the four of us had a very enjoyable few hours with twenty-six species seen.

Last Month's Quiz answer

Medium long legs, shortish tail, slim bill, triangular head and upright stance suggests that last month's mystery bird is a species of wheatear, a family of birds well represented on our island with 11 species occurring either as regular visitors or vagrants, throughout the year.

One species, Cyprus Wheatear is an endemic breeding summer visitor, while another Finsch's Wheatear occurs in winter. All other species are mostly recorded on migration, with spring being probably the best time to observe them. Adult males are usually distinctive but some females can be quite tricky. Our mystery bird is mostly brown with a darker throat, wings and an orange-red vent. These features can exclude Northern, Isabelline, Desert, White-crowned, Cyprus and Black-eared Wheatears (which all show a white vent) as well as Finsch's, Hooded and Mourning Wheatears which can show some stain on the vent but have either black-and-white plumage (in the case of males) or are paler grey with a less pronounced dark throat (female birds). Our mystery bird is therefore a Kurdish Wheatear, a very rare passage migrant or winter visitor with just 6 Cyprus records. The dark throat but rather drab plumage probably suggests that our mystery bird is a young male.

Amiandos (Amiantos), Limassol/Troodos

Coordinates: 34.9166° N, 32.9367° E



All-year-round sightings may include –

Northern Goshawk, Διπλοσίχινο, *Accipiter gentilis*

Coal Tit, Πέμππεσος, *Periparus ater cypriotes*

Blue Rock Thrush, Γαλαζοκότσυφος, *Monticola solitaries* – breeding suspected June 2012; one male on territory 10 April 2014 and one male 6 April, one female type 1 June and a male 27 June 2015

Eurasian Blackbird, ♂ Μαυρόπουλλος (♀ Μαυρότζικλα), *Turdus merula*

Common Chaffinch, Σπίνος, *Fringilla coelebs*

During spring and summer the other breeding species to be found in the area include –

Common Quail, Ορτύκι, *Coturnix coturnix* – one Pano Amiantos on 16 July 2015

Northern House Martin, Ασπροχελίδονο, *Delichon urbicum* – four seen at nest site 26 March 2014 followed by large post- breeding flocks of c300 July 2014 and six seen entering nest holes 4 March 2015

Eurasian Crag Martin, Βραχοχελίδονο, *Ptyonoprogne rupestris* – four observed 23 July and 13 August 2014

Cyprus Wheatear, Σκαλιφούρτα, *Oenanthe cypriaca*

European Serin, Μπασταρτοκανάρινο, *Serinus serinus*

Winter species may include –

Grey Wagtail, Σταχτοζευκαλάτης, *Motacilla cinerea* – seen at the Botanical Garden during autumn and winter months 2015

Mistle Thrush, Τριζάρα, *Turdus viscivorus* – noted there 10 January 2012

Amur Falcon, Ασιατικό Μαυροκίρκινο, *Falco amurensis*

This spectacular Falcon, which breeds in Siberia and Northern China before migrating in large flocks, was photographed by Paul Curry on 30 April 2016. It had sat perched on wires at Anarita Park on the look-out for its favourite food, crickets or lizards. In flight it shows the remarkable under-wing, vent and leg plumage.



This accidental vagrant was discovered at Anarita Park 28 April 2016, staying until 15 May 2016 and is the first record of this species in Cyprus. A slightly shorter account of the report sent by the author to the UK website Birdguides is produced with the author's permission on pages 169-170 of BirdLife Cyprus Annual Report 2016.

SYSTEMATIC LIST FOR FEBRUARY 2019

3146 bird records received

170 species and forms recorded February 2019, compared to 155 in February 2018.

[Please note, the list has been edited for the purposes of this newsletter and contains records that have not been corrected or corroborated.]

The following species were also recorded in February 2019: Chukar, Black Francolin, Northern Shoveler, Mallard, Common Teal, Little Grebe, Common Woodpigeon, Eurasian Collared Dove, Common Moorhen, Common Coot, Cattle Egret, Little Egret, Grey Heron, European Shag, Black-headed Gull, Yellow-legged Gull, Little Owl, Western Marsh Harrier, Eurasian Buzzard, Common Kingfisher, Common Kestrel, Eurasian Magpie, Eurasian Jackdaw, Hooded Crow, Great Tit, Crested Lark, Zitting Cisticola, Northern House Martin, Barn Swallow, Common Chiffchaff, Cetti's Warbler, Eurasian Blackcap, Sardinian Warbler, Song Thrush, Eurasian Blackbird, European Robin, Black Redstart, European Stonechat (**112** records), House Sparrow, Spanish Sparrow, Meadow Pipit, White Wagtail, Common Chaffinch, European Greenfinch, Common Linnet, European Goldfinch, European Serin.

COMMON QUAIL *Coturnix coturnix* Ορτύκι



MONTHLY WATERBIRD COUNT

February 2019

Markos Charalambides

The BirdLife Cyprus waterbirds monitoring programme has been running since 2005 and covers around 70 wetlands and other waterbird sites around the island. All sites are covered at least every January (mid-winter count) and every May (breeding season count), while the more important sites are also covered in March, September and November. Key Important Bird Area (IBA) wetlands such as the island's two salt lakes, which attract large numbers of birds, are covered on a monthly basis. The monitoring programme is based on the voluntary work of a team of dedicated and experienced recorders and preliminary results are presented in the Monthly Checklist.

For February, 8 recorders covered 26 wetlands (including one coastal site) across the island where a total of 13591 birds, of 56 different species were recorded.

The most abundant species was the Greater Flamingo with 5519 individuals. The second most abundant species was the Black-headed gull with 2190 individuals followed by the Coot with 1519 individuals.

The wetland holding the most birds, as well as being the most species abundant was Larnaka Salt Lake with 5172 individuals and 23 different species. Mia Milia Sewage Works was second in terms of number of individuals recorded as well as being second in terms of species abundance with 2017 individuals from 18 different species being recorded

Paphos Sewage Farm only had one species recorded.

Agia Varvara Village reservoir had no waterbirds present.
