# YOUR BIRDING SIGHTINGS ARE IMPORTANT. PLEASE DON'T FORGET TO SEND THEM TO THE RECORDER

Whether you go out bird watching regularly or just enjoy noting what you see when out on a walk, any record of what you see is important to help us keep an up to date database of the birds of Cyprus.

Most people submit their records on a monthly basis. To be included in the Systematic List that appears in the Monthly Checklist please make sure that Jane receives your records by the 10<sup>th</sup> of the following month or are added to BirdTrack by that date. But don't worry if you miss the deadline, your sightings will still be added to the database and be used in compiling the annual Cyprus Bird Report. On occasions, you may be asked to provide extra details of rarer birds or of those seen out of season or away from their usual locations. This is something that happens to all observers and is not a reflection on anyone's bird watching skills! A list of the species for which a Rare Bird Report is required can be obtained from Jane.

There are several ways to make sure that your records count by submitting them to the BirdLife Cyprus Recorder, Jane Stylianou who will add them to the country database:

Use the Cyprus portal of BirdTrack <a href="http://blc.birdtrack.net">http://blc.birdtrack.net</a> or download our <a href="recorder">reporting excel</a>. The recorder is happy to receive your sightings by email but where possible please try to use either BirdTrack or the Excel form. # **CAN YOU HELP?**

Do you have some spare time during August and September? Do you have good English writing skills? Are you familiar with the birds found in Cyprus?

If so maybe you would be interested in helping with the Cyprus Bird Report 2018. I am looking to expand our editorial team and need people with the above qualities to help with the compilation of the species accounts for that report. You would be expected to follow the Report's style code and be able to understand and summarise information from an excel form. Plenty of help will be provided so don't worry if you haven't done anything like it before. It is likely that you will be asked to write up around ten species in the first instance. Below is a typical example of what a finished species account is like:

## GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE Anser albifrons Αρκόσιηνα

A regular winter visitor from December to February, occasionally November to March. Numbers much-decreased in last decade.

Another poor year for this species.

**First winter period:** *Larnaca Sewage Works*: The group of seven present from late 2015 were reported until 14-Feb (FGe, CR, JS, SC, AKir, KH *et al*). Only reported from this location.

**Second winter period:** *Oroklini Marsh*: The first record for the period was five low over Oroklini Marsh 11-Oct (AG). *Larnaca Sewage Works*: Five 21 – 30-Oct (STi, JN, JS). Then six 10 - 19-Dec (JN, JS, KH) rising to seven 24-Dec (KH).

For most instruments it is unnecessary to type in the degree and minute symbols (° & ') or the N and E letters.

# Asprokremmos Dam and Mandria Field Meeting 13th APRIL 2019

The challenge in organising this Field Meeting was overcoming two problems. Firstly, and a common theme for recent times, some of the sites that we normally visit were devoid of birds and secondly, as a consequence of the very (very!) wet winter, access to some sites had become difficult to the extent of being too difficult to risk with "normal" cars. Hence the itinerary was adapted so as to maximise the chance of seeing birds and minimise the driving problems. This meant a restriction to only three sites and spending longer at each. The plan proved successful and the Meeting did not finish until almost 4.30pm!

We only met at Asprokremmos Dam because that was the advertised meeting place. 20 people arrived. Despite considerable searching, as feared, we found few birds of note. Plenty of common species but only a pair of Great Spotted Cuckoos and a Purple Heron will have made many people's notebooks.

Mandria and Anarita Park were not visited. instead we made for Timi Beach, or more accurately the Timi wetlands produced by all the rain. Here we saw Little and Cattle Egrets, Purple and Squacco Herons and Glossy Ibis. Waders were also present, including Spur-winged Lapwing, Common and Wood Sandpipers, Ruff and Black-winged Stilt. The birds that absorbed the group the most (and for longest) though were male and female Citrine Wagtails. The Citrines were together in the same area and relatively close, giving everyone the opportunity to admire the male and study the plummage differences between the sexes. A Common Kingfisher was seen taking advantage of this abnormal area of wetland, plus the sole duck species of the day – Mallard. Other birds of note were a Tree Pipit, a male Common Redstart and a Nightingale that interrupted our lunch break! At least one member of the group opted out of lunch and so did not see the Redstart and Nightingale, but compensated by seeing Whimbrell and Gull-billed Tern flying along the coastline.

Departing from the wetland area, we unexpectedly saw a rather late Desert Wheatear on the coastal rocks.

Our third and final stop was Agia Varvara. This site had recently been good for crakes and did not disappoint. We found 5 Little Crakes and a Baillon's Crake. A Little Bittern was on show in the same small stretch of water edge reed as the Little Crakes. A lone Sedge Warbler also came into view on those reeds. Cetti's Warblers were less co-operative, restricting themselves to being heard but not seen. We did add to our list of waders for the day though, with two Green Sandpipers.

To summarise the numbers, 55 different species were seen plus 3 more that were heard but not seen.

Best observation of the Field Meeting? I would say the Citrine Wagtails, but others might argue for a tie between them and the Little Crake / Little Bittern combo at Agia Varvara.

# Cape Greco Field Meeting 20th April 2019

At 8am on a rather cold but sunny spring morning, nine members and friends met at our new gathering place, the parking area opposite the Cape Greco Environmental Centre, for our spring field trip to Cape Greco and the surrounding area.

After gathering we set off for our first stop, the area of bushes on the way down to the antennas. We parked our cars and scanned the vegetation and surrounding rocky area. Recent northerly winds meant there were few migrants and it was soon evident that we would have to work hard for our birds. With a bit of searching however, amongst the many House Sparrows the bushes revealed a couple of Common Whitethroats, a Black-eared Wheatear and a Willow Warbler, while the surrounding area had lots of Crested Lark, a pair of Cyprus Wheatear and a Tawny Pipit. With little else around, we decided to move on to our next stop, the Cape Greco Picnic area.

We parked by the picnic area and walked NE along the coastal tracks above Konnos Bay, an area of scrub and trees that can be very good for migrants. Our first bird was a very obliging male Cyprus Warbler, which flew between exposed perches singing its distinctive scratchy song. Equally friendly, was a Woodchat Shrike, hunting and feeding on beetles from a snag just a few metres away from us. A Hobby flew over as we moved parallel to the coast below, while either side of the path, in the trees and bushes we had a couple of Blackcaps, a Lesser Whitethroat, a Spotted Flycatcher, a Wryneck and some many resident Greenfinch. House Sparrows again were plentiful and finding "proper" birds amongst them was a challenge. Coming in from the sea we noticed another small falcon, this time a female Red-footed Falcon, a good addition to our day list. Walking back to the car we had a couple of flyover passerines, always tough to identify on brief flight views. One looked like a female Black-eared Wheatear while the other was a female black-and-white Flycatcher sp.

After a brief break for refreshments our next stop was the Cape Greco Seacaves. Here, we walked up and down the dirt tracks and paths, towards the fenced area surrounding the old rubbish tip. We saw families of **Spectacled Warbler**, including many begging young being fed by their parents, lots of Crested Lark, a Cyprus Warbler, a couple of Cyprus Wheatear, a Woodchat Shrike and a **Northern Wheatear**. It was however rather quiet and we decided to move onto Agia Napa Sewage Works.

At Agia Napa Sewage Works we stopped along the road by the main gate and walked parallel to the fence. This proved a good strategy as we had good views of 3 species of Flycatcher, a female **Pied Flycatcher**, a male **Collared Flycatcher** and a couple of **Spotted Flycatchers**. Further along, we had a singing male Cyprus Warbler, a Sardinian Warbler and at least two singing **Olivaceous Warblers**.

It was approaching midday and just four of us were left, Lyn, Alan, Daniel (a visiting birder from Sweden) and myself so we decided to all get in my car and drive to the hard to get to Agia Paraskevi Pond, a small pond between the church of Agia Paraskevi and Kermia Hotel, a seldom visited but usually very interesting area. After some driving between the dense acacias we managed to get to the pond which, due to the recent good rains, had lots of water. The area surrounding the water was also quite overgrown but through the thick brush we could see most of the lake. We managed to add quite a few species to our daylist including **Squacco Heron**, a couple of **Little Crake**, **Coot**, **Moorhen**, **Little Grebe**, **Sedge Warbler** and **Marsh Harrier**.

That was our final stop and we drove back to our cars where we ended our field trip, one where there weren't lots of birds but nevertheless was very interesting and gave us the opportunity to visit a number of different places and habitats in the Cape Greco area.

# Arodes and Androlikou Field Meeting 27th April 2019

A new area for a BirdLife Cyprus field trip attracted 27 participants in 15 cars. The weather being warm and sunny made an enjoyable day of bird watching.

Whilst waiting for the members to arrive at Arodes, a **Turtle Dove** could be heard calling but could not be located although 3 were seen later. We drove a short distance out of the village and parked where we then started a walk around the vineyards where **Black Francolin** could be heard calling. We stood in area watching a male and female **Eurasian Blackcap**, **Whinchat** and **European Greenfinch**. Good views of **Red Rumped Swallow** were seen and many **Corn Bunting** were seen and could be heard singing. We had our first distant view of a **European Roller** along with **Jackdaw**. In a hedgerow nearby **Greater Whitethroat**, **Lesser Whitethroat** and **Zitting Cisticola** were seen. A **Northern Wheatear** was seen high on a tree top but the light made ID difficult, a photograph by Mike Covington confirmed this ID. A **Marsh Harrier** was observed hunting over the fields and a **Long Legged Buzzard** was perched nicely on a rock.

We then moved on to Pittokopos and started our decent down to the village of Androlikou. An inquisitive **Black Headed Bunting** came looking what all the fuss was about as we pulled up at the side of the road. **Common Quail** were head calling from the corn fields along with Zitting Cisticola. A **Tree Pipit** was perched on the wires above and **Crested Lark** were on the road side. As we neared the village, European Roller could be seen along with a **Common Kestrel** and **Cyprus Wheatear**. Whilst observing a **Spotted Flycatcher**, **European Bee Eater** were heard above, we were then treated to good views of a pair of Long Legged Buzzards which came flying over us.

We drove then to Smygies where we had lunch before a walk around the area. **Masked Shrike**, **Woodchat Shrike** and a female **Red Backed Shrike** were seen. **Great Spotted Cuckoo** were heard by Alan. Also in the area was a female **Pied Flycatcher**, Spotted Flycatcher, Eurasian Blackcap, **European Goldfinch**, European Greenfinch, **Great Tit**, Cyprus Wheatear and a **Cyprus Scops Owl** could be heard calling.

A total of 42 species were seen.




#### Last Month's Quiz answer

Last month's bird quiz showed two birds roosting with their heads tucked into their backs concealing most of their face and bill. Their behavior, habitat and overall shape should easily identify them as species of wader while their overall jizz and size compared to the nearby Salicornia bush should suggest that we are dealing with two small sp. Wader.

Identifying the species on the right might be more straightforward. Overall pale underparts, very dark brown upperparts, dark median crown and lateral crown stripe as well as white supercilium suggests one small species of wader, Broad-billed Sandpiper. Broad-billed Sandpiper is an uncommon spring and autumn migrant, it's shape and overall jizz could be reminiscent of the much commoner Dunlin or even Little Stint but their boldly striped head, split supercilium and dark upperparts sould, given reasonable views, easily distinguish it from commoner species.

The second species is rather less obviously marked but having identified the slightly larger species as Broad-billed Sandpiper should give us an indication that this is a very small bird. The pattern on the back rules out any small Plover species so we are left with just two species of Stint, Little and Temminck's Stint. The two are very different, Temminck's Stint showing a plainer back and more greyish overall plumage while our mystery bird shows a distinctive white tram line on its back and more colourful plumage, identifying it as the commonest small species of wader, Little Stint.

# A – Z of Bird Watching - Anavagos - Androlikou

#### By June Neal

## Anavagos, Paphos District

Co-ordinates: 34° 47' 45" North, 32° 27' 0" East

To the East of the village there are hills and valleys, with areas providing shelter for several migrant species. Rarer species include:

One Olive-tree Warbler, Ελιοτρυβητούρα, Hippolais olivetorum on 28 April 2013

A single Icterine Warbler, Κιτρινοτρυβητούρα, *Hippolais icterina* was noted on 12 March 2015 and also on the nearby hillside on 19 April that year

Eastern Orphean Warbler, Θαμνογιαλλούρα, *Sylvia crassirostris* may be seen here – singleton on 13 March 2014 was reported

Subalpine Warbler, Γκριζοφτέρι, *Sylvia cantillans* – two were seen 15 Mar, three 27 Mar and tow 1 April 2014

Rüppell's Warbler, Εληοβάτης, Sylvia ruppeli one male was present 15 March 2019 between thunderstorms between Konia and the hills

Semi-collared Flycatcher, Δρυομουγιοχάφτης, *Ficedula semitorquata* – Singles were reported here 6 and 13 April 2014 and a male and a female were also observed there 5 April 2019 A female Rufous-tailed Rock Thrush, Πετροκότσυφος, *Monticola saxatilis* was recorded 31 March 2013

Tree Pipit, Δενδρογαλούδι, *Anthus trivialis* – 50+ were recorded on 16 April 2014 ater more than 40 were there on 11 and 13 April

Eurasian Siskin, Θκιολαρούδι, *Spinus spinus* – noted here in 2017 during the first winter period and spring

Breeding species include:

Little Owl, Κουκκουφκιάος, Athene noctua

Cyprus Warbler, Τρυπομάζης, Sylvia melanothorax

European Goldfinch, Σγαρτίλι, Carduelis carduelis

During autumn migrant flocks of Demoiselle Crane, Νυφογερανός, *Anthropoides virgo* may be heard migrating over the area as on the evening of 27 August 2014.

#### Winter visitors may include:

Dunnock, Θαμνοψάλτης, *Prunella modularis* – In 2017 one was noted in the hills 20 February and again on 25 November

Rose-coloured Starling, Ακριδοπούλλι, *Pastor roseus* – Three were seen in Androlikou village, morning of 13 May 2019

Tree Pipit, Δενδρογαλούδι, *Anthus trivialis* – may be seen in high numbers: 30+ being noted between Prodromi and Androlikou on 17 april 2014

Cinerous Bunting, Σμυρνοπιτίλλα, *Emberiza cineracea* – A male and a female were seen 21 April 2012

Breeding species which may be seen include:

European Nightjar, Νυκτοπούλλι, Caprimulgus europaeus

Bonelli's Eagle, Σπιζαετός – Περτικοσιάχινο, *Aquila fasciata* which fly over the area

Cyprus Scops Owl, Θουπί, Otus scops cyprius

European Roller, Κράγκα, *Coracias garrulus* - 15 were recorded 13 May 2019 during a Common Bird Monitoring Survey

Woodchat Shrike, Κοκκινοκεφαλάς, *Lanius senator* – up to two were recorded between here, Smygies and Neo Horio on six dates from 10 June to 13 July 2014 with a pair on wires noted 14 June then an adult seen with a juvenile at the same location on 4 July 2014. In 2015 this species was noted in the area between 12 and 24 June but no mention of fledglings

Black-headed Bunting, Τιρίλινγκος, *Emberiza melanocephala* – which may be seen between here, Neo Horio and Lara from April until mid-summer when dispersal begins through to August

In summer of 2015 up to three Lesser Kestrel, Κιρκινέζι, *Falco naumanni* remained in the Androlikou to Pittokopas are between 2 – 25 June 2015 but no breeding evidence was found.

Other species noted on 13 August 2018 include:

Four European Roller, Κράγκα, Coracias garrulus were noted on the Droushia to Androlikou road Lesser Grey Shrike, Σταχτοκεφαλάς, *Lanius minor* - One adult noted

Masked Shrike, Δακκαννούρα, *Lanius nubicus* - One adult with five juveniles on the Droushia to Androlikou road

Woodchat Shrike. Κοκκινοκεφαλάς. *Lanius senator* were observed

Eastern Olivaceous Warbler, Τρυβητούρα, *Iduna pallida* – One was seen along the Droushia to Androlikou road

Cyprus Wheatear, Σκαλιφούρτα, *Oenanthe cypriaca* – One seen in the village area after two were seen on 11 August 2018

Other autumn species reported include Steppe Buzzard, Στεπογερακίνα, Buteo buteo vulpinus

In 1988 reference was made to the common, local resident species - Jackdaw, Κολοιός, *Corvus monedula*. That year the highest number recorded was c500 at Androlikou on 12 November 1988.

#### MONTHLY WATERBIRD COUNT

#### **April 2019**

#### Markos Charalambides

The BirdLife Cyprus waterbirds monitoring programme has been running since 2005 and covers around 70 wetlands and other waterbird sites around the island. All sites are covered at least every January (mid-winter count) and every May (breeding season count), while the more important sites are also covered in March, September and November. Key Important Bird Area (IBA) wetlands such as the island's two salt lakes, which attract large numbers of birds, are covered on a monthly basis. The monitoring programme is based on the voluntary work of a team of dedicated and experienced recorders and preliminary results are presented in the Monthly Checklist.

For April, 7 recorders covered 15 wetlands across the island where 2232 birds, of 51 different species were recorded.

The most abundant species was the Greater Flamingo with 1079 individuals. The second most abundant species was the Little Stint with 211 individuals followed by the Black-Winged Stilt with 130 individuals.

The wetland holding the most birds as well as being the most species abundant site, was Larnaka Salt Lake with 881 individuals from 25 different species. The site with the second most individuals recorded was Akrotiri Salt Lake with 697 individuals. Akrotiri Meras and Oroklini Marsh both had 15 different species of bird present.

Strakka Pools only had 4 individuals from 3 different species recorded.
